Background:

“Child Care Advocacy and Canadian Policy Processes: History and Practice from World War II to the Present” was a research project conducted from April 1999 to March 2001, sponsored by the Child Care Advocacy Association of Canada (CCAAC), and funded by Child Care Visions, HRD Canada. The Principal Investigator was Dr. Susan Prentice (Sociology, University of Manitoba) who worked closely with a Project Advisory Team comprised of Rebecca Scherer, Wendy Atkin, and Maryann Bird, as well as the CCAAC Executive Director Cynthia Magloughlin.

Research Produced:

The research project produced several products, also on deposit where this *Archival Listing* is found:

- oral history interviews with child care advocates (N=52);
- a bibliography on child care advocacy;
- an archival listing of sources for historical research on post-WWII child care advocacy in English Canada;
- a poster depicting images of child care advocacy from 1945 to the present (English and French versions);
- an edited anthology of original analysis, *Changing Child Care: Five Decades of Child Care Advocacy in Canada* (Ed. S. Prentice, 2001. Fernwood Books: Halifax), which also contains excerpts from selected oral histories;
- a web page; and
- a CD ROM, which contains digital copies of the oral history transcripts, the bibliography on child care advocacy, and the archival listing of historical sources.

BACKGROUND

The following is a list of sources which may be useful for those researchers interested in the post-WW II history of Canadian child care advocacy. Like many community groups, most child care organizations have made *ad hoc* arrangements to preserve their papers. Some groups retain their papers, often depositing their historical files with successor organizations. Others have deposited their records in archives associated with their municipality, province or local educational institution. Frequently, uncatalogued papers remain with individual child care advocates, in basements or attics.

Throughout the “Child Care Advocacy and Canadian Policy Processes: History and Practice from WW II to the Present” project, we sought to identify historical sources. The result of our efforts is the archival listing you are reading. The archival list is organized provincially, moving from west to east, followed by Canadian English sources at the end. We included all sources we were able to identify, generally through the ‘snowball’ effect of asking key informants what they knew about organizational files and historical materials. Esyllt Jones had primary responsibility for assembling this list, working with the Principal Investigator for the project.

The records included in this listing indicate an interest in, and/or a contribution to, child care advocacy. In the case of public archives, researchers can obtain detailed finding aid and file information by contacting the public repository. For privately held records, the content and extent of records is unknown and finding aids are unavailable. To learn more about private collections, please contact the organization or person listed.

We realize this is a partial and incomplete list. We urge researchers who locate sources of child care advocacy history to contact the Child Care Advocacy Association of Canada, and inform them of the holdings. We also urge child care advocacy organizations to find ways to preserve their records. It is the opinion of the researchers involved with this project that the absence of historical infrastructure is a liability as we seek to learn more about the history of child care advocacy and public policy. We recommend that child care research funding programs include archival identification and record preservation as part of the work of child care research.

This should include material assistance to child care advocacy groups for the human and physical resources required to ensure their legacy is preserved.
